# Tentative makeup plans for missed days

Battle Ground Public Schools has developed a plan for students to make up the school days that were missed this year due to indement weather, and has tentatively set the last day of school for Friday, June 23. To meet Washington state's school attendance requirements, Battle Ground's plan extends the school calendar at the end of the year, eliminates some early release days, and includes a request to the state to waive some of the missed days.

The plan is tentative until approved by both the Board of Directors and the state, and could be altered if additional indement weather impacts the school calendar. The waiver request must meet state requirements, including providing students with a minimum of 1,027 instructional hours during the year and making up a minimum of three of the missed school days. The changes are:

Specifically, the following changes have been made to the 2016-17 school calendar:

Feb. 9-10: Early release days for end of semester March 1: Regular, full day March 15: Regular, full day April 19: Regular, full day May 5: Regular, full days June 8-9: Regular, full days June 15-16: K-8 early release days for parent-teacher conferences June 19-20: Regular, full days

June 21: Regular, full makeup day June 22-23: Early release makeup days

For high school seniors, the graduation dates will not change.

Hello Pleasant Valley Parents and Families,

Well it looks like we have all survived Snowmagedon 2017. We sometimes think that we have all kinds of power and abilities as



humans and then something like a foot of snow, and below freezing temperatures for a week, shows us that there are forces beyond our control. Although I made it to work for all but one of those days to check on our building, the extra snowcation did throw off the rhythm a little bit. # Pleasant Valley Primary A note from Principal Michael Michaud



Families of Pleasant Valley Schools,

Next week you will receive your child's official standards-based report card for Semester One. Please check your child's backpack early next week. The report card will show your child's understanding of the standards that have been covered to this point

in the school year. In addition, the report card shows grades for behaviors, your child's attendance record, and assessment information.

Our K-4 report card separates grades on academic subjects from grades on student behaviors, allowing teachers to more accurately report student learning. Your child will receive two kinds of grades: one is based on his or her understanding of academic subjects and scored on a scale from 1-4, and the other is based on his or her demonstration of successful learning habits and scored on a scale of T (typically), S (sometimes) and R (rarely).

The goal for our students is to achieve a 3 in all subject areas. A 3 indicates that a student understands the content to this point, and is on track to move to the next level of learning. This involves students increasing their understanding throughout the school year so that by the end of the year the student is ready for the next grade level's standards and expectations. A 4 is reserved for work that

BUMP, SET and SERVE! Boys and girls will increase their volleyball skills and abilities through team play. ### Mad Science (Primary School):

registration is open! Class begins April 19 with 6 class sessions held after school.

Observation, Hypothesis, and Experiment are the foundations of scientific exploration. But be prepared to be am azed...you'll have trouble believeing your own eyes or ears on this spellbounding epedition through the science of sound, magic, illusion and color!

Detectives Science: There's a crime afoot! Break out your magnifying glasses and search for dues. Run your own investigation as your Mad Scientist reveals techniques in fingerprinting, chemistry and other skills used by crime scene investigators.

Lights, Color, Action: Take a journey through wavelengths and prisms to shed some light on science! Perform experiments that mix colors of light together and then separate them again! Build a machine that can create white light from the colors of the rainbow! demonstrates considerable depth of knowledge beyond proficiency and could involve complex reasoning skills, multi-step problem solving, and integrated learning standards.

We encourage you to speak to your child about his or her progress. Please contact the school directly with questions related to the information highlighted on the report card. The report card is not the only method for communicating with parents. Teachers provide a variety of communications, including parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, emails, and phone calls throughout the year to discuss learning and student progress. You are encouraged to contact your teacher at any time with questions.

### Safety

### Volunteers

We are appreciative of all parents who are willing to commit time and energy to helping students succeed and to provide an excellent place of learning for all students. It takes a combined community to accomplish this, and we welcome volunteers to join in the goal of making our school be the best that it can be. With that said, every volunteer must register in the main office upon arrival. When entering the office, the volunteer must register in the Volunteer Sign-in Log maintained at the office counter top. The name of the volunteer and the date and time of service should be recorded. A visitor's sticker should be picked up and worn during service. At the end of the volunteer time the volunteer should report to the office and sign out.

We believe that parent volunteers play a key role in

the classroom and other school-related activities. Please provide me with as much advanced notice as possible if you cannot volunteer for a scheduled time. An email or a phone message would be greatly appreciated. Volunteers should be willing to perform a wide range of assigned tasks and activities such as copying, cutting, sorting, collating, putting up or taking down bulletin boards, and working directly with all students.

It is important that the students have consistency within the classroom. Therefore, it is very important that the parent volunteers follow the guidance, approach, and fundamental concepts that are delivered and demonstrated by the teacher/staff. Students need to stay focused on the learning task in class so I would appreciate it if any distractions are kept at a minimum. Cell phones will need to be turned off or placed on vibrate. If an emergent or personal issue arises that requires you to use your cell phone, please step out of the classroom and out of the view of the class and students while using your phone. Volunteers shall exercise mature judgment in supervising children and shall in all instances respect each student's rights and privacy. It is essential that confidentiality is maintained and any concerns should be discussed directly and exclusively with the supervising teacher/staff. Disciplinary action is the legal responsibility of school administrators and school
