

"State of the School" message and report

from my perspective as interim principal. The knowledge, learnings, and amount of shared information that took place this year could fill a book. One of the most critical components in education is how we listen to and learn from each other in our partnership of teaching and learning. Pleasant Valley Primary/Middle School(s) and community is a very special place.

All of us are learners and all of us are teachers. "Let me be sure, I understand what it is, you understand, then I will be a better Learner and Teacher, too." This is a quote that I am reminded of every day. Some of the things that we learned this year were:

*Increased understanding of improved teaching strategies and authentic literacy assessment that will advance the acquisition of literacy skills in all of our students.

*Expansion and improved articulation of science, technology, and math curriculum.

*Improved coordination, collaboration and participation between Physical Education and our Health & Wellness program.

*Improved student safety and security throughout the campus.

*Improved communication between the schools' administration and operations.

I could go on and on about the successes and improvements but, I won't because I want to, "Thank you for welcoming me and making me feel appreciated throughout this school year." I mean it, when I say, "Pleasant Valley is a very special place to work, live, and learn." In my career as a school administrator, I have had the privilege and responsibility of being the principal or assistant principal of 7 different schools, in 5 different school districts, in 3 different states. Along the way, I have also worked with a wide range of school districts, schools, educational professionals, and organizations throughout the United States and parts of Canada.

I am proud and privileged to have ended my professional career here at PVP. The level of commitment and dedication of the staff is beyond reproach. I have observed and participated in meetings, work sessions, and collaborations that had the sole purpose and focus of each child's educational success. This has been and will continue to be done at a level that pushes the envelope of thinking and at the same time challenges our bias that have been shaped by our backgrounds, habits, families, society, and other influences.

With that being said, we/you are going to experience a tremendous amount of change between now and the

beginning of the next school year. For example:

- *Implementation of 5, full-day kindergarten classrooms.
- *Installation and occupation of a 10-plex for the 3rd and 4th graders.
 - *Relocation of at least 13 classrooms and other personnel.
- *Hiring of new staff members (teachers, an instructional coach, and some classified personnel).
 - *New routines, schedules, procedures, and programs.
 - *Professional development in math, literacy, assessment,

Instructional Interventions, and other curricular areas. Remember, it's not who you are, it's what you do and the imprint you make that will be remembered. My only hope is

hard to help our students make the best decisions about schoolwork and positive character.

I recently read an article about inspiring teens to practice work habits that will lead them toward being respectful adults. The author mentioned that the key to helping teens develop healthy habits involves getting teens interested in being the best. How does that work? The author explained that teens need examples of respectful habits modeled for them. She talked about allowing teens to see positive relationships between mom and dad, sisters and brothers, home and school.

Parents, I appreciate your support in helping your children have a productive school year. Please continue to expect the best from your children. Continue to ask about their homework, peer relationships, and relationships between them and their teachers. Regardless of the profession your child chooses, my hope is that he/she will mature into a respectful and responsible adult.

Successful professionals practice common habits. They ask good questions, consider other perspectives, collaborate with others, persist, seek new challenges and frequently examine self. I encourage you to continue participating in the work of shaping our teens for the future.

We have been taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment. This state test is designed to measure students' knowledge of specific contents and their ability to apply their knowledge in problem solving situations. Parents can be a great help to students in test preparation. Encourage study and review of subjects; show interest and ask questions about school assignments. Also, ask your child how they develop their ideas or answers, practice vocabulary words in your conversations and encourage reading and writing at home. Parents, please continue to participate in the various facets of our school. Continue encouraging your child to do his/her best. Your involvement supports, encourages and motivates us.
